Job Purpose

The Production Manager is responsible for production managing Theatr Clwyd's in-house productions. They will actively employ their significant levels of specialist knowledge and experience to support the Head of Production in delivering the best possible service to all stakeholders.

Key responsibilities

General

- Production manage Theatr Clwyd productions as required.
- To co-ordinate and oversee a high standard of delivery of scenery, props, costume, lighting, sound and all other aspects of physical production within agreed briefs, budgets and timescales.
- To be accountable for the outcomes of and make decisions on behalf of the Producing Team and technical and production teams
- To employ a creative and forward-thinking approach to problem solving to ensure the team works together smoothly, effectively and supportively within the organisation as a whole.
- To manage the freelance production roles on in-house shows as required.
- To be responsible for finance, research management and financial reporting of Theatr Clwyd production budgets and delegating elements of production budget responsibility to colleagues as appropriate.

Production Management

- Ensure that all creative teams, visiting companies and artists feel welcome, engaged and supported in the building and receive the highest level of technical support at all times.
- Liaise with guest creative team to determine the technical needs for productions and advise on what technical possibilities Theatr Clwyd can offer.
- Support the Head of Production in liaising with freelance production managers and provide support as required.
- Manage production weeks, ensuring that rehearsals and production meetings run smoothly.
- Manage production budgets.
- Production manage Theatr Clwyd's work on tour as required.
- In the case of projects that are co-produced with Theatr Clwyd but managed by a
 partner theatre, to play a coordinating role between the partner theatre's
 production team and the Production Department at Theatr Clwyd and offer
 support to the partner theatre as necessary.

Equipment

- Hire or purchase specialist equipment and/or technical support as required for productions.
- Guide technical and production teams in storing and maintaining stock items of furniture, properties and settings as required.

Safety

- Uphold and promote safe working practice in line with Health and Safety procedures.
- Complete risk assessments and method statements and comply with CDM regulations as they apply to theatre productions.

Audiences and Seating

- Work with the Head of Production and Senior Experience Manager to provide and maintain a safe environment for audiences.
- Keep the Communications and Giving team informed of seat numbers for each production and deliver accurate seating plans as soon as possible.

Management

- Line-manage Deputy Production Manager
- Arrange and supervise freelance, fixed term and casual staff who will be specific members of each production team, for example Stage Management.

Other

- Provide the highest level of audience care and service at all times.
- Represent and positively promote the organisation at all levels.
- To promote and improve environmental sustainability through effective planning and management of all productions, using the Theatre Green Book, and across all elements of the role.
- Perform any other duties as reasonably requested by the Head of Production.

- Significant depth of skill and experience in production management in a producing theatre and/or degree level / equivalent qualification in a relevant subject.
- · Proven experience of managing teams.
- Proven experience of financial management including budget and financial reporting.
- · Excellent communication and negotiation skills.
- Excellent attention to detail.
- Excellent planning and organisational skills, with the ability to manage multiple work streams and work under pressure.
- Excellent knowledge of all technical theatre and production disciplines.
- Excellent drafting skills and extensive experience in the use of CAD software.
- Thorough working knowledge of licensing and Health and Safety legislation.
- A commitment to artistic excellence.

Desirable

- Good working knowledge and practical experience in Adobe CS (Photoshop, Illustrator) and an understanding of digital print.
- First Aid qualification.
- Knowledge of theatre, dance and other art forms within the UK generally and Wales specifically.
- Written and spoken Welsh.
- Full clean driving licence.
